This is a summary of how our school delivers music education to all our pupils across three areas – curriculum music, co-curricular provision and musical experiences – and what changes we are planning in future years. This information is to help pupils and parents or carers understand what our school offers and who we work with to support our pupils' music education.

Part A: Curriculum music

- Broadway Primary's music curriculum is part of the GROW curriculum.
- All classes receive quality music teaching. We spend an hour delivering music to classes each week.YR-Y3 teach directly from the GROW curriculum which is supported by KAPOW. Year 4-6 teach from the GROW curriculum which is supported by CARANGA. All children in Y4-Y6 are taught a Brass Instrument – these include the trumpet and baritone cornet.
- There are many opportunities for children to sing and learn songs as well as having experiences on instruments: glockenspiels, ukuleles, keyboards, djembe drums as well as other general percussion instruments.
- We are finding opportunities to perform. This academic year, so far, this has included Christmas Carol singing and Christmas Brass song playing. We have also already planned for a musical evening at the end of the academic year and music often features in our Broadway Best festival.

Part B: Co-curricular music

- Our school choir meets every mist weeks to prepare for our Young Voices concert (usually in February). There is also the opportunity for the children to participate in various Christmas carol performances.
- Some children are taking piano lessons outside of school.
- A number of our children are involved in amateur dramatic societies and work towards performances in local venues.

Part C: Musical experiences

There are many other opportunities for children to participate in music activities within and outside of Newbarns School.

- During assemblies as part of the school day. Music listening as children are
 entering and leaving the hall and singing hymns as part of the assembly. Music
 styles are also played throughout the building with a theme of the week. This is
 displayed and the theme explained.
- Each child has the opportunity to perform in a production. EYFS+KS1 (Nativity),
 LKS1 (Easter) and UKS2 (Summer) All children wear costume and learn and
 perform all songs. Final performances are open to parents.
- Every year children in Years 5 & 6 are given the opportunity to participate in a Young Voices concert. For us, these are held in Manchester and give a fantastic, full concert experience for the children involved. In the months before, we learn songs which we perform on the night. The evening consists of other live music which the children watch.
- We work hard with our local high school top support us with music and have visited the school to see a range of instruments in use.
- Each week we hold a music club led by a professional music teacher
